

## Longevity/Site Fidelity for Birds Retrapped in 2009

- The long lived Reed Warbler (N592592) shown in the table was ringed as a juvenile in 1999 and was not trapped again until August 2005, as a breeding male and then not again until 2008 and again this year. It is currently our longest lived passerine ringed at Stanford.
- The Whitethroat from 2002 (P 774799), ringed on 3<sup>rd</sup> August of that year was retrapped seven years, less a day, on 2<sup>nd</sup> August this year and represents a new <u>European longevity record</u> for the species.
